RIDE DESCRIPTION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

The ride will take place among the pines in the beautiful Prescott National Forest, Groom Creek Horse Camp on Senator Highway--located ten miles south of Prescott, Arizona. The terrain varies from grass meadows to tall pines. Although challenging, the trails are neither too steep, narrow, nor too rocky. The altitude may be higher than you are accustomed to, so please have your animal in good condition. The country is extensive and spectacular. You will camp in the same place all three days and will not have to move your rig. Meals will be provided for Friday night dinner, Saturday breakfast, saddlebag lunch, and dinner and Sunday breakfast, and saddlebag lunch. There will be a happy hour on both Friday and Saturday nights with appetizers and an auction. The entertainment will be fun and varied between music and storytelling. A large campfire will be burning both nights for atmosphere. Please join us for three days of food, fun, entertainment, and great riding.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. NO dogs in main camp OR on trail rides. Dogs may be at your campsite only. No Barking dogs will be allowed. These rules will be strictly enforced.
2. Please place a red ribbon in horse's tail, if he kicks, for the safety of others.
3. Horse water will be provided. People must bring their own water.
4. Many of the camp sites now have portable corrals and all have picket lines. Please bring old inner tubes to protect trees if additional picket lines are needed.
5. Camp is to be quiet by 11:00 p.m.
6. NO individual camp fires.
7. An adult guardian must accompany riders under 16.
8. Please bring your own chair to sit around the campfire.
9. NO stallions are allowed in camp or on the rides.
10. Please adhere to the trail rules.
11. All persons present in camp must be paid entrants of this event; it is not necessary to ride.
12. No lone horseback riding away from camp; you must be with a trail boss at all times.

13. Weather conditions are highly unpredictable, with temperatures ranging anywhere from the 40s at night to 80s during the day.
14. Manure and old hay is to be disposed of in dumpsters on site in plastic garbage bags provided. Upon departure, please leave your camp site as clean as possible.
15. Please do not arrive before 11:00 a.m. on Friday and plan to leave no later than 2:00 p.m. on Sunday.

- Water for emergencies & traveling
- Feed (three days plus travel)
- Supplements (salt, electrolytes, etc.)
- Vet box, medications, etc. (suggestions)

- Bute
- Corona
- B-Calm
- Bandages & Betadine
- Horse treats
- Leg wraps
- Lead ropes
- Water buckets
- Grooming tools

- Leather (strings, latigo)
- Electrolyte Paste
- Vet wrap
- Wound Dust
- Horse blankets
- Easy boots
- Fly spray
- Water buckets (for hauling water)

Other Items

- Canteen – two or four quart
- Saddle bags
- Electric fence or corral panels or picket rope
- Extra bridles, saddle pads, blankets, cinch, and halter
- Manure fork & rake

People Needs

- Sleeping bags
 - Medications
 - Paper towels & toilet paper
 - Matches
 - Handy wipes
 - Silverware
 - Fire extinguisher
 - First aid kit
 - Hand cream & sun screen
 - Jacket, both light and heavy
 - Tools
 - Extra clothes in case of rain
 - Water for you for three days
- Pillows
 - Dish and hand soap
 - Wash clothes & towels
 - Garbage bags
 - Lawn chairs
 - Propane lantern & propane
 - Flashlights
 - Lip balm
 - Hats or sun visors & sun glasses
 - Rain gear
 - Air compressor
