Speaking of tough, the Arizona cowgirls brought the heat in tonight's barrel racing. In fact, the top five fastest times in the barrel race, were all Arizona cowgirls. Shelly Shure from Queen Creek, Ariz. and Karen Olsen from Marana, Ariz. made the fastest times in the barrel race, tying with a 19.32 second run. These girls weren't the only fast Arizonans, Travis Ericsson from Scottsdale, Ariz. and partner Cody Pearson, from Tucson, Ariz. won the Team Roping with a 9.1 second run.

Due to a change in format, the World's Oldest Rodeo adopted back to back slack, meaning that the timed event contestants make their first run in the morning and their second run at the performance in the evening. Slack begins at 8 a.m., and is free to the public.
